

### WHAT WE DO

Deaf and Hard of Hearing children and adults often have trouble accessing the services and supports they need. This can be a major obstacle to living independently.

The Foundling has a dedicated team of specialists trained to work with children and adults who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing. Operating as part of our evidence-based Partners for Change program, our team uses Functional Family Therapy – Therapeutic Case Management, an evidence-based model that has been proven to help families overcome challenges.

Our staff, including Interventionists,
Therapists, and Social Workers, are fluent
in American Sign Language (ASL). We
also employ a team of staff ASL
Interpreters, who are available to further
facilitate communication.
